Construction of internal garage at Naivasha Technical Training Institute, Kenya

Fondation Eagle Reference: FF 704

Name of Charity: Footsteps International (UK registered charity number 1091026)

Introduction

On 7th December 2023, Fondation Eagle accepted our project proposal and awarded Footsteps International a grant of GBP 10,477.

The aim of the project was to construct a new internal motor vehicle garage which will provide a facility for trainees to learn, while simultaneously providing income from the public, and reducing NTTI's need for financial support from external donors.

The project involved site clearance, ground levelling, material purchase, construction of a secure stone perimeter wall, installation of a metal gate, water and electricity, a service pit, and construction of an office and a store. This project is the first, important step towards a larger income-generating project for NTTI. The project plan is in Annex 1.

The **project beneficiaries** will be the 350 full time trainees, as the income generated by this project will help NTTI provide low-cost training in all disciplines.



More specifically, approximately 180 automotive trainees will benefit each year by working in the garage when it is fully operational (NTTI runs two motor vehicle courses, each with 30 trainees, with 3 annual intakes).

We **received the grant** on 21st December, 2023 as part of a grant of GBP 41,527 for four projects for which we had applied for funding.

We transferred funds to Kenya on 22nd December, 2022.

Construction of the 60m x 30m facility was completed in September 2024, and it has already been put to use.


Project achievements

The construction process is illustrated in the following photos:

1. Site clearance: 60 feet (20 metres) of cactus perimeter hedge was cleared



2. Delivery of construction materials: This was done in sequence as needed for construction, and included stones, ballast, sand, cement, timber etc.







3. Trenching: Labourers were engaged to excavate the trenches for the foundations and pillars to support the entire enclosure.





4. Foundations & Walling: Having laid the foundation stones, a stone wall was constructed around the external perimeter to a height of 10 feet (3 metres) on the






side facing the public road, and to a height of 6ft (2 metres) where it faces into the institute.

4. **Security grille:** Metals grilles were fabricated and mounted on the lower walls to provide additional security and beautification.





5. Security gates: There are two gates. A wider gate provides the entrance and the exit for clients, while a smaller gate provides access for staff and staff vehicles. These gates and the wall-top grilles were fabricated by a former trainee and a street boy Francis Juma.





6. Office and Store: This was constructed near the main entrance with masonry walls, timber roof joists and ceiling, then the iron sheets were laid.









7. Water installation: was carried out by our trainees in Plumbing department.







8. Service pit for checking vehicles



9. Electrical Installation was done by our trainees on the electrical course, under the supervision of instructors





10. Car wash machines purchased and installed.





11. Car washing bay: Compacted hardcore was used for the car wash bay area

Project benefits

With their very generous donation, Fondation Eagle has enabled NTTI to take a major step forward in generating income to sustain the institute. The internal garage is now available for parking, car washing and vehicle repairs, which will generate income and raise the profile of the institute in the eyes of the public. Additionally, we will be able to use the facility to provide training opportunities for 180 automotive students who train with us each year.

With time, we are expecting the garage to generate income through:

- i) Car parking for 40 vehicles per day
- ii) Car washing of at least 15 vehicles a day
- iii) Vehicle services of at least 5 vehicles a day

Our trainees will also be able to undertake their industrial attachments, giving them excellent practical exposure.

Expenditure summary

Our estimated cost for the project was 1,864,979 Kenya Shillings (KES) at an exchange rate of GBP 1 = KES 185. We received the grant on 21st December, 2023 as part of a grant of GBP 41,527 for four projects for which we had applied for funding. We transferred funds to Kenya on 22nd December, 2023, obtaining an actual exchange rate of GBP 1= 197.4 KES.

Our project team delivered the project for KES 1,866,908 a very small overspend of 1,929 KES. However, overall, the project was delivered **underspent against budget by GBP 623**; this was the result of a favourable exchange rate when we transferred the funds to Kenya, and tight budget control.

Summary of project successes and benefits

Successes:

This project has helped NTTI make a major step forward as the provider of income generating services that benefit the trainees. It provides the basis for further expansion of services in future years, and adds to the professional stature of the Institution.

Challenges:

Kenya experienced a period of intensely heavy rain which resulted in flash floods and loss of life in the Rift Valle area. This impacted the speed with which the project could be delivered.

In June and July 2024, riots and demonstrations against the government broke out in cities and towns across Kenya, including Naivasha town. This led the project team to review the safety and security of the internal garage, and, after considerable discussion it was agreed that additional security measures were needed to protect vehicles and reassure customers. These were outside the scope of Fondation Eagle's funding, so the money was made available by Footsteps International from their general fund. The measures are now in place, and the details are provided in Annex 2.



Annex 2: Additional security measures report

Introduction:

In June and July 2024, riots and demonstrations against the government broke out in cities and towns across Kenya, including Naivasha town. This led the project team to review the safety and security of the internal garage, and, after considerable discussion it was agreed that additional security measures were needed to protect vehicles and reassure customers

On 6th August 2024, Footsteps International provided KES 920,606 (GBP 5,625) to NTTI so that the additional measures could be taken.

Funded Project

After receipt of the money the following have been undertaken:

a) Cactus Fence: The stone wall has replaced the cactus fence and students have really appreciated the work done. The view of the fence from the main gate downwards is now very clear. The dark spots where thieves could hide are now gone. This clearance and construction of stone wall has given the institution a new look except for the portion where AIC Agape Church is domiciled and the section by the water selling point. Photos provided are a manifestation of the new look of the institution front.

b) <u>Electric Fencing</u>: the required items were purchased by the contractor, a former NTTI electrical trainee who has acquired skills in electric fencing and CCTV installation. The photo below is a clear indication of the technical capability of our former trainee. The high standard of his workmanship is clear in this work. Security of the garage is now greatly enhanced by the fencing.





c) <u>CCTV Installation</u>: After finishing the electric fence successfully the former trainee Mr. Kamau again was given installation of CCTV work and he procured the necessary materials and equipment and commenced the work within a short time, installing 6 cameras, cabling, monitoring screen, DVR channel, hard disk and relevant accessories. Views of the road, the fence, the garage compound can now be seen on the screen installed inside the office at the garage. Any malicious activities can now be easily monitored on the screen. This is a great deterrence of any person with intentions of entering the compound unauthorised.

Our estimated cost for the additional security measures was 921,753 Kenya Shillings (KES) at an exchange rate of GBP 1 = KES 163.66. Footsteps transferred funds to Kenya on 6th August, 2024, obtaining an actual exchange rate of GBP 1 = KES 163.66.

Our project team delivered the project for KES 921,690 a tiny underspend of 63 KES, a total of **GBP 5,632.**
